I am grateful for the opportunity to serve an organization that is so
dedicated to advancing the equality of women and girls, and the principles of justice for all people. Every day is a new learning experience, and I look forward to helping make BWIC an even more responsive and valuable asset to the Berks community.

In January 2013 **Christine Gilfillan** assumed the newly-created position of Associate Director at Berks Women in Crisis. 2013 was a transition year, with Christine assimilating new duties while still directing the Education & Community Outreach Department. In January 2014 BWIC hired Tasha Isaac to direct the department, and Christine transitioned fully to Associate Director.

The creation of the Associate Director position supports the agency's need for succession planning, and supports the efforts of Executive

Director Mary Kay Bernosky to renew her focus on development activities. Christine's new duties include overall supervision of the Counseling, Residential Services, and Education & Community Outreach departments; organization of the agency's Systems Advocacy and Medical Advocacy efforts; and new program development.

Christine, who has been a BWIC staff member since 2001, served as an agency volunteer from 1987 – 1999 and a member of the Board of Directors in 2000. As Director of Education & Community Outreach, she made her mark by creating and launching a number of initiatives, including CAMPpeaceworks, a teen alliance for Social Justice, now in its eighth year.

In May 2013 Christine received the Governor's Victims Service Pathfinder Award for Prevention Education and Community Outreach, and completed continuing education programs at the Nonprofit Center at LaSalle University's School of Business, earning certificates in Nonprofit Management, Marketing & Communications, Fundraising, and Financial Management. Christine is passionate about her work.

our new director of education and community outreach

Tasha Isaac, a Community Educator in Peace-Works for nearly five years, was recently selected to fill the position of Director of Education and Community Outreach, a high-profile and extremely busy position in and outside the agency.

Tasha is passionate about her work at Berks Women in Crisis. She did not begin college with a human services direction. She originally thought she would follow in her mother's footsteps as an accountant. What she quickly realized, after taking a class in psychology, was that she was more interested in the people who needed help than the numbers on a ledger. Her community also meant

a lot to her and Tasha believed that the education she was pursuing should help her to make a difference as well as necessary changes wherever and whenever possible. Her beliefs have come to fruition; she makes a difference every day at Berks Women in Crisis.

After Tasha earned her Associates Degree in Psychology at RACC, she worked for a few years in the Reading School District. She then returned to school to earn her Master's in Human Services from



Lincoln University in 2007. Soon thereafter, she joined the staff at BWIC as the Children's Advocate in the shelter.

When asked about hergoal in the new position, she stated that she "would like to expand our reach. We have our hands in lots of different things, but I want to create a stable handle on awareness of domestic violence and sexual assault in the community. We can talk to children all day long but they still have to go home where they may encounter violence, or perhaps pass it on the street, and watch it on TV. To change a community you must reach students and their parents simultaneously – not an easy task."

If she could wave her magic wand over Berks County, she would also like to address the "inequity in education. There is a huge

disparity (in resources) among the school districts. Some issues are linked to funding, and others are related to more careful and wise utilization of the resources available."

nature explore[®] classroom



On November 21, 2013, Berks Women in Crisis officially dedicated its Nature Explore[®] Classroom, a roof top garden space with safe

access for all BWIC residents. The Nature Explore Classroom is a unique outdoor learning environment that is specially designed to help children develop a profound connection with nature while healing from the trauma experienced from witnessing abuse in their homes.

Research shows that nature buffers the impact of life stress on children and helps them deal with adversity. Nature-based classrooms have been found to lower aggression in children, reduce the effects of chronic mental fatigue and increase the coping ability of children living in poverty. It also helps build resiliency, a critical skill for the estimated 3-4 million children who witness or experience domestic abuse each year in the United States.

Nature Explore Classrooms are traditionally constructed in areas where children have regular access to schools, parks and child care centers. However, children living in domestic violence shelters do not have access to these public areas because their safety could be jeopardized.

BWIC is the first women's shelter to receive a Nature Explore Classroom in Pennsylvania, a gift funded by Mary Kay Inc. and The Mary Kay Foundation. The \$1.2 million partnership with the

Arbor Day Foundation is the largest corporate collaboration for Nature Explore Classrooms delivering 20 of the unique outdoor spaces to women's shelters in 13 states over the past four years.

In addition, Kirsten Gappelberg, who attended the Ribbon Cutting on behalf of Mary Kay Foundation, presented BWIC with a \$20,000 check to support BWIC Safe House programs. Kirsten recognized the community support BWIC receives as evidenced by the attendance of many state and local representatives at the Ceremony and the innovative programs that BWIC offers, both factors weighed heavily by the Mary Kay Foundation when determining funding priorities.

The Mary Kay Foundation was created in 1996, and its mission is two-fold: to fund research of cancers affecting women and to help prevent domestic violence while raising awareness of the issue. Since the Foundation's inception, it has awarded nearly \$34 million to shelters and programs addressing domestic violence prevention and more than \$20 million to cancer researchers and related causes throughout the United States.





For more than 50 years, a purchase from the **Woman's Exchange of West Reading** has been a gift that gives twice – once to the recipient, and a second time to local charities who receive all of the profits. For the past two years, that beneficiary has been Berks Women in Crisis. The Woman's Exchange of Reading is one of several Woman's Exchanges throughout the United States. These non-profit gift shops are staffed by volunteers and sell mostly artisan goods, many crafted by local artists. The origin of the "exchanges" dates back to the 1800's when women "teamed up" to make some money by selling their hand-made goods.

Last year, the Board of Directors of the Woman's Exchange decided to revamp the store to create the look of a high-end boutique, renaming it **"It's a Gift!"** The shop now sports a black and white striped canopy and a brightly-colored gift as its logo.
